FEMA Offering Two New Training Opportunities

FEMA has two open training courses available in Emmitsburg, MD through the Emergency Management Institute. The first 4-day course will run from July 28-31 and will cover retrofitting flood-prone residential buildings. The second 4-day course will run from August 18-21 and will train participants on FEMA's Coastal Construction Manual, created for planning, designing, and constructing residential structures in various coastal environments. CEUs and CECs will be awarded for the completion of either

New Advanced Permit Certification Coming Soon

The Board for International Professional Standards (BIPS) has reviewed the survey results for an advanced level of Permit Technician, and has approved a new category – **Certified Permit Specialist**. To become a Certified Permit Specialist, applicants will first be required to pass the Permit Technician Exam and second, pass the soon-to-be-developed “Administrative” exam. This exam will be used for the certification categories where the title is “Specialist”, and will be a prerequisite to obtaining certification as a Plumbing, Mechanical, or Fire Code Specialist.
